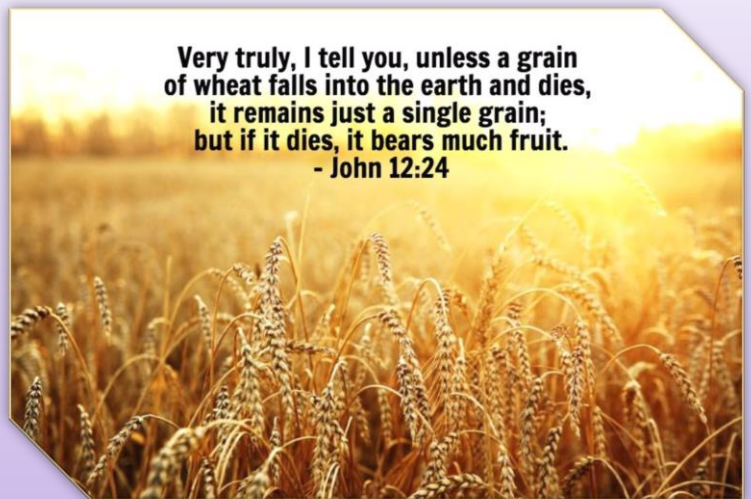

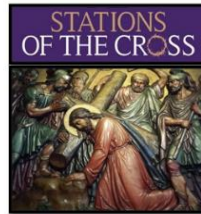

What is the Chrism Mass?

The Chrism Mass is presided over by the Archbishop and concelebrated by the priests of the Archdiocese. Parishioners from throughout the Archdiocese take part.

It is a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their Bishop. At this mass, the priests renew their priestly commitment.

The blessing of Holy Oils is a central rite in the Chrism Mass. The Oil of Catechumens for use in the sacrament of Baptism and the Oil of the Sick for the anointing of the sick. The Oil of Chrism is consecrated for use at the sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. At the end of Mass, these Holy Oils are presented to representatives of all parishes who will present them to their parishes at the beginning of the Easter Triduum at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday.

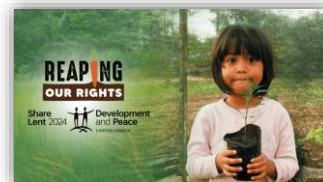

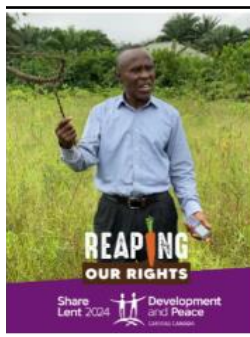
