REFLECTION

Today is the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Christ the King will restore all creation and restore his kingdom to the Father. WHAT IS ADVENT?

Advent means coming. During the four weeks before Christmas we look forward to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and to our Christmas celebration of His coming as our saviour over 2,000 years ago. Advent is a period of four weeks of prayer and preparation, of renewal and of looking forward to the coming of the Lord Jesus among us.

The four themes are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Advent is not a time of penance like Lent. It is a season of renewal, when God invites us to let Jesus come onto our hearts. It is a season of quiet expectation; we live it in the expectation of the fullness of joy to come. Let us not lose sight of the true meaning of the season.
