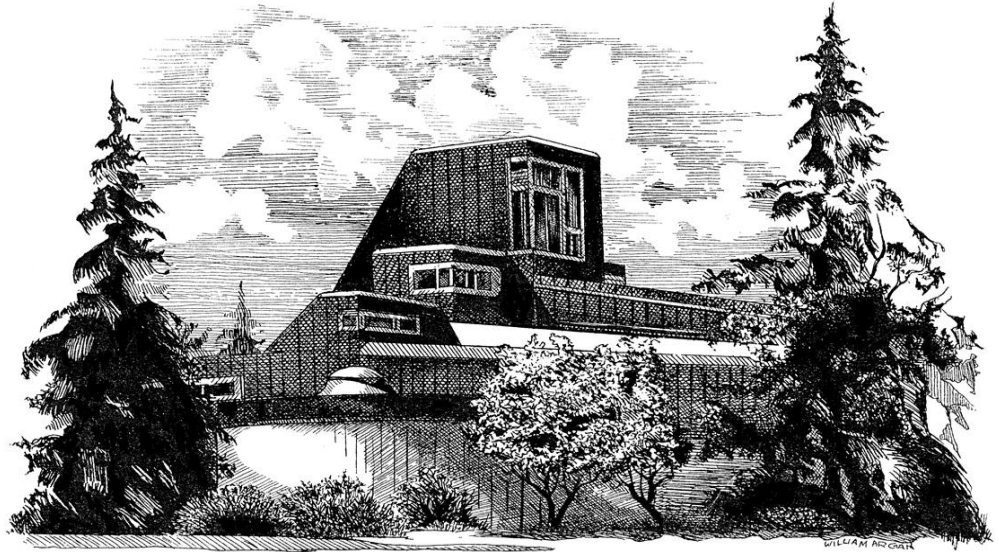

Peter on how St. Anne Parish offers ministry and sacraments in the next six months. For the foreseeable future, the parish will continue to have a rotation of visiting priests for the weekend Masses.

As of January 1, 2020, Rev. Arpee Urquico is serving in a parish in the Diocese of Hamilton. He remains a priest in good standing who is incardinated into the Archdiocese of Regina.

Effective January 1, 2020, Rev. Parker Love will work alongside Rev. Stephen Bill in vocations with the intent that he become the Vocations Director of the Archdiocese of Regina on August 1, 2020.

Our preacher will be Pastor Joel Russell MacLean (First Baptist, Regina). All are welcome. As an island nation, boats are an important part of Maltese life.
