


Cuernavaca Project



The Cuernavaca Project was started in 1989 when Bishop Charles Halpin wanted our diocese to support the diocese of Cuernavaca, Mexico. The Charles Halpin Center for Encounters and Dialogue (CED Mexico) was born to facilitate community development. CED Canada has been working to establish an ag/tech school in Cuernavaca to create self sufficiency. Breaking the poverty cycle means they will not have to rely on our support.

Just 4 Words That Indicate It's God's Voice: Pope Francis Explains

... a voice that pacifies, encourages, and reassures in difficulties.

"The voice of the Lord can always be recognized; it has a unique style — it is a voice that pacifies, encourages, and reassures in difficulties," Pope Francis said this <u>January 4 on concluding his</u> teaching series on <u>discerning</u> God's voice from among the other interior and exterior voices we hear.

And then he repeated one four-word phrase that is said in the Gospel over and over. The Pope himself repeated it a handful of times today.

The Gospel reminds us of this continually:

"Do not be afraid" (Lk 1:30), how beautiful is the Angel's word to Mary after the resurrection of Jesus;

"Do not be afraid,"

Do not be afraid" - it is the style of the Lord,

"Do not be afraid."

"Do not be afraid!" the Lord repeats to us today too,

"Do not be afraid": If we trust in his word, we will play the game of life well, and we will be able to help others. As the Psalm says, his Word is a *lamp to our feet and a light to our path* (cf. 119, 105).
