### UPDATE

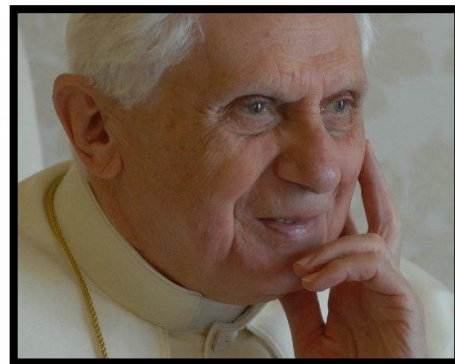

This money will be used to support ongoing maintenance of our infrastructure and to revitalize our program operations.

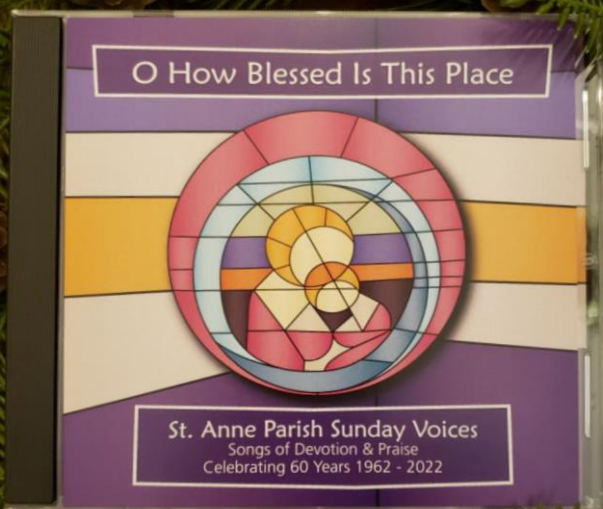

## GREEN RIBBON CAMPAIGN

JANUARY 28 & 29, 2023
