

WHAT ARE WE DOING AS A CHURCH?

We are truly saddened, and we grieve with our First Nation brothers and sisters for the loss of their innocent children who were deprived of the affection of their families and of full life. This is another difficult moment for all Canadians.

Despite the pain that we all share, it is important you know the Archdiocese of Regina has been in constant contact and dialogue with our First Nation brothers and sisters. For years, Archbishop Don Bolen himself has met and continues to meet with elders and leadership of First Nations.

Archbishop Don walks quietly and prayerfully with them. He stands with them in this moment. Over the years Archbishop Don has offered apologies on numerous occasions. He will continue to do so going forward.

Canadian Bishops have also offered apologies and have asked forgiveness. Reconciliation requires continuing efforts.

We cannot give up!

The Archdiocese of Regina is providing all necessary support to locate and identify cemeteries and unmarked graves at Residential schools.

As mentioned June 24th by Archbishop Don in a Radio Canada interview, there is a plan already under way for Canadian Bishops to travel to Rome by the end of 2021. This will offer first nation leaders an opportunity to meet and speak with the Pope.

The Parish of St. Anne stands in solidarity and in prayer with our First Nations brothers & sisters. We continue to pray for healing from this tragic part of Canadian history.
