\$58,265.00




We can now continue on with the many projects that need to be done to get our building & grounds in tip-top shape.

SURVIVORS IN TURKEY AND SYRIA NEED YOUR SUPPORT!

At 4:17 a.m. on February 6, a magnitude 7.8 earthquake shook Turkey and Syria. Many aftershocks followed. Buildings collapsed like houses of cards, trapping thousands of people. Over 11,000 people have died and more than 55,000 have been injured. The toll is expected to rise as rescue workers continue removing victims from the rubble.

Our partners in the Caritas family are already mobilized on the frontlines, providing blankets, food and emergency shelter for families who find themselves on the streets. But the needs are great, especially for populations that have already been made vulnerable by 12 years of conflict in Syria.
