What Is The Chrism Mass?

The Chrism Mass is presided over by the Archbishop and concelebrated by the priests of the Archdiocese. Parishioners from throughout the Archdiocese take part.

It is a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their Bishop. At this mass, the priests renew their priestly commitment.



The blessing of Holy Oils is a central right in the Chrism Mass. The Oil of Catechumens for use in the sacrament of Baptism and the Oil of the Sick for the anointing of the sick. The Oil of Chrism is consecrated for use at the sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. At the end of Mass, these Holy Oils are presented to representatives of all parishes who will present them to their parishes at the beginning of the Easter Triduum at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday.



Our Lenten Program, **"Leave it at the Cross"** will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Knowing that we all carry <u>heavy burdens</u> each day of our lives, we invite parishioners (and friends/family with whom you'd like to share this program), both young and old, to leave their burdens in the basket placed **at the foot of the Cross** in front of the altar.

Special little cards/envelopes will be available at Mass to complete either in church or at home after discerning what burdens you are carrying and would like to give to the Lord. After completed, return your sealed envelope(s) and place in the basket at the foot of the Cross. There will be opportunity to fill out many cards throughout Lent.

All your precious requests (sealed envelopes) will be burned in the fire prepared for the celebration of **Mass on Holy Saturday. (April 8th).**

Lent is a perfect time to take an inventory of your spiritual life!

Take advantage of the Lenten season by looking over your life, discovering your strengths and weaknesses.

Lent presents to us a unique time of the year when we are invited to look inside ourselves and at our spiritual lives, discovering the good and bad that is there.

If we are to be completely honest with ourselves, we will notice many areas that need growth and improvement. This can often be difficult for us, as we may not always want to see our faults and failings.

However, it is important to take a **spiritual inventory during Lent**, as it gives us an opportunity to reconcile ourselves with God.

Pope Benedict XVI recommended this practice in his <u>message</u> for Lent in 2011.

[T]he Lenten journey, in which we are invited to contemplate the Mystery of the Cross, is meant to reproduce within us "the pattern of his death" (*Ph* 3: 10), so as to effect a deep *conversion* in our lives; that we may be transformed by the action of the Holy Spirit, like St. Paul on the road to Damascus; that we may firmly orient our existence according to the will of God; that we may be freed of our egoism, overcoming the instinct to dominate others and opening us to the love of Christ. The Lenten period is a favorable time to **recognize our weakness and to accept, through a sincere inventory of our life**, the renewing Grace of the Sacrament of Penance, and **walk resolutely towards Christ**.

For some of us, this spiritual inventory will be more difficult to endure, as we already know our weaknesses and fear that more light upon our sins will lead us into despair.

The good news is that God reaches out to us in his mercy, ready to accept us into his loving arms. We need not be afraid of our failings, as God is ready to pick us up and set us on the right path.
