


Buildings and Grounds Initiatives with total donations of \$58,265.00

Our Lenten Program, "Leave it at the Cross" will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Knowing that we all carry <u>heavy burdens</u> each day of our lives, we invite parishioners (and friends/family with whom you'd like to share this program), both young and old, to leave their burdens in the basket placed at the foot of the Cross in front of the altar.

Special little cards/envelopes will be available at Mass to complete either in church or at home after discerning what burdens you are carrying and would like to give to the Lord. After completed, return your sealed envelope(s) and place in the basket at the foot of the Cross. There will be opportunity to fill out many cards throughout Lent.

All your precious requests (sealed envelopes) will be burned in the fire prepared for the celebration of **Mass on Holy Saturday. (April 8th).**

WHY IS LENT FORTY DAYS

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues until the evening of Holy Thursday. Sundays are excluded from the count, therefore ending up with forty days. The forty-day length of Lent is rooted in the biblical usage of the number forty. Forty is typically indicative of a time of testing, trail, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel. Other forty-day events found in the Bible:

- 1. The great flood was forty days and forty nights. (Gen 8:5-6).
- Moses spent forty years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery. (Acts 7: 29-30).
- **3.** Moses fasted for forty days and nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tablets of the covenant. (Ex 34:28)
- **4.** The Israelites spent forty years wandering the desert. (Jos 5:6; Num 32:13).
- 5. The prophet Elijah spent forty days in the desert before encountering God on Mount Horeb. (1 Kgs 19:8).
- 6. The Ninevites were given forty days before God was going to destroy the city, allowing time for repentance and conversion. (Jon 3:4-5).

THINGS TO REMEMBER DURING OUR LENTEN JOURNEY

- 1. It is a time of prayer.
- 2. It is a time to fast.
- 3. It is a time to work on discipleship
- 4. It is about dying to yourself.
- 5. Don't do too much.
- 6. Lent reminds us of our weakness.
- 7. Be patient with yourself.
- 8. React out in charity.
- 9. Learn to love like Christ.
