

Ascension of the Lord

The Ascension does not mark the end of Jesus' relationship with the Church but the beginning of a new way of His relating to the world, in and through the Church.

'Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. "If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God..." For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what He promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies.' (St. Augustine)

In most Catholic Churches throughout the world, the feast of the Ascension was celebrated on Thursday, May 13, 2021, but for pastoral reason, in Canada and in other part of the World it is transferred and celebrated on Sunday, May 16.

After His resurrection for 40 days, the Risen Lord appeared and showed Himself to His Disciples so as to rekindle their faith and bring them to the understanding and belief in His Resurrection. Then, today, on the Feast of Ascension, we celebrate his return to Glory, to the right side of His Father where He came from.

SGI will be issuing a one-time rebate to vehicle owners this month.


