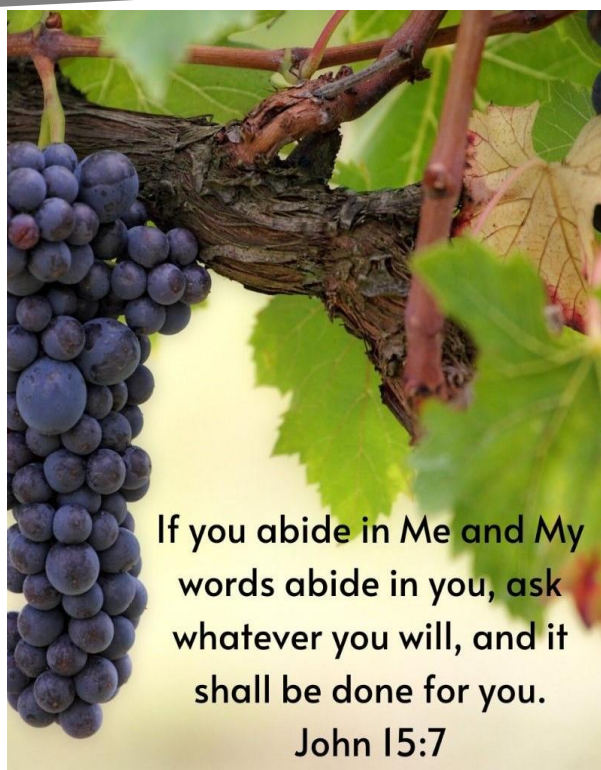

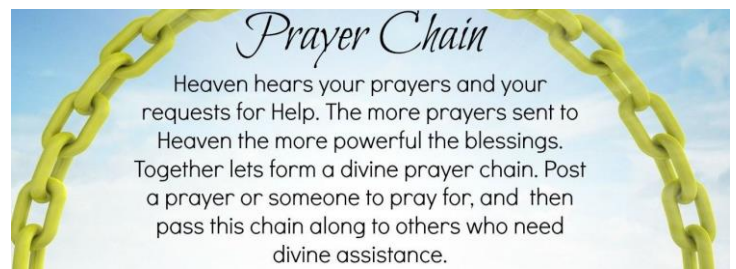
St. Anne Parish Doorstep Blessings

It has been a long-standing Catholic tradition to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in May. In most Catholic churches (and in many catholic homes), a “May Altar” is erected with a statue or picture of Mary, Flowers, and perhaps Candles. The altar stands from May 1 to 31 as a reminder of Mary’s importance in the life of Jesus, Church and in our own lives as well. Additionally, many Catholic churches and families hold a “May Crowning,” presenting Mary with a crown made of blossoms or other hand-crafted materials to signify her queenship as the mother of Christ, the King.

❖ Pray to the Blessed Virgin Mother.

I would like to believe that she taught Jesus how to pray. Jesus is God, but He is also man. He had to learn to converse with God somehow. Boy, did Jesus pray! He prayed every moment He could! He prayed alone, in the desert, in the mountain of Olives, among his disciples. Mother Mary was instrumental on His prayerful disposition.
