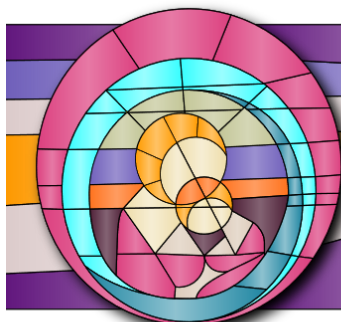

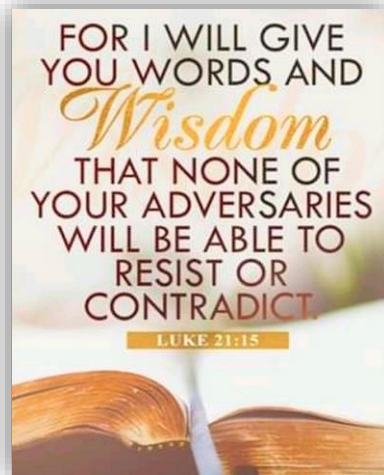

We are pleased to announce that St. Anne Parish is now able to respond to parishioner's requests for additional ways of supporting our church. This is in addition to the current methods of cash, cheque (either through collection or through the office), on-line with Canada Helps, and the greatest gift, your time by volunteering.

1. INTERAC E-TRANSFER: This method is becoming a favourite with Canadians, as it is quick, easy, and, depending on your banking package, no or low cost. The email address to use to send money to St. Anne's through Interac E-Transfer is office@stannesregina.com. No password is required! Simply include your name in the memo field and the reason why you are transferring funds (i.e., collection, building fund, CWL, Good Neighbour Project, etc.). The funds will be securely transferred to St. Anne Parish, and the amount will be added to your charitable tax receipt in the new year, if applicable.

2. VIRTUAL BOTTLE DRIVE: Have you experienced the great convenience of SARCAN's Drop & Go service? You literally drop your bags of recycled cans and bottles off at SARCAN and leave. You don't have to wait for them to count the cans and bottles. St. Anne Parish, Regina is running a virtual bottle drive through the Drop & Go service to support the Green Thumb Ministry and live plants in the church. All you have to do is type "blessings" at the Drop & Go kiosk when you are prompted for the "group phase" to print out your stickers. It's that easy! Complete step by step instructions on how to use Drop & Go are available at St. Anne's website under the tab "Giving" and Green Thumb Ministry.

If You Have a Catechism, You Have Answers!

LESSON FOUR – Cracking the Catechism Code!

What is a brief history of the Catechism?

Many scholars think the first known Catechism was the *Didaché*. Also known as the *Teaching of the Twelve Apostles*, possibly written in the 2nd century AD. From an unknown author, the text survived as one manuscript with only 16 chapters, appearing to be the teachings written directly from apostolic preaching and perhaps the first Christian literary text and oldest catechism. *Didaché* is the Greek word that means "teaching". The current *Catechism of the Catholic Church* originated from a Synod of Bishops in 1985. After 24,000 suggested revisions, Pope John Paul II officially approved the definitive version and publicized it on December 8th, 1992 with an apostolic constitution.
