### **Reflection – 28<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Often when we read this Gospel, we think that only the poor enter the kingdom of God. But what is meant by "the rich." God gives us so many gifts. He calls us to share those gifts with others. So being rich in gifts but not sharing them is a great waste. It is this wasting of talents that is a sorrow to God. The more talents we are given, the more that is expected of us by God. Jesus said to the man at the beginning of the Gospel that he was to "sell what you own and give the money to the poor." This can be seen somewhat metaphorically. God calls us to give of ourselves and to use our talents to honour Him. We are to give to those who have less. So, we are to share our faith with those who have none. We are to use our talents to show non-believers how wonderful it is to be in communion with God. It is only through giving our lives to God and sharing that experience with others, can we help others to come to a relationship with Him. Our lives belong to God.

There are many ways to share with the Church to help it evangelize and bring others to understand the power of being in right relationship with Jesus and the heavenly Father. The Archdiocese of Regina, through its various departments provides support to parishes so that we can work together to help people come to trust in God. The Bishops of Saskatchewan announced a new  
province-wide appeal for support of Healing and  
Reconciliation - sponsored by our dioceses and eparchy  
here in Saskatchewan. Then overall goal of this  
campaign is to support Indian Residential School  
survivors and their communities, and to engage more  
deeply in our own ongoing commitment and response  
to the Truth and Reconciliation process.

Upon the commitment of the Canadian Council of  
Catholic Bishops to move forward with a \$30 Million  
goal from all Catholic dioceses in Canada, this appeal  
will be counted among those efforts.

former residential schools, Education and Cultural
