SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

On Sunday, October 10th, Pope Francis solemnly inaugurated the Synod on Synodality. This unique process of consultation will last 2 years and will aim at hearing from all Catholics Faithfull throughout the world.

In launching the Synod on Synodality, Pope Francis is innovating by proposing three phases of reflection: local, continental, and then Roman.

The local phase is to last six months and mobilize all dioceses and parishes (until March 2022) and will result in a 10-page synthesis in each diocese. These will then be sent to the national episcopal conferences for a comprehensive synthesis. These documents will then be sent to Rome to serve as a basis, from September 2022, for new discussions at the continental level. These will lead to the elaboration of new syntheses that will then serve as a foundation for the final synodal phase in Rome in October 2023.

This Synod on Synodality is a great opportunity for all Catholic faithful to participate in the life of the Church. Pope Francis through this Synod would like to hear from every Catholic and he wants all to be involved in this very important process.

In the Archdiocese of Regina, this Synod on Synodality will be inaugurated on Sunday, October 17th at 3 Pm at the Holy Rosary Cathedral with an opening Mass presided over by Most Rev. Don Bolen, Archbishop of Regina.

All Catholics faithful are invited to attend or to follow the celebration on livestream.

Reflection – 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

James' and John's request to be given a favour by being seated at Jesus' left and right, unfortunately, is very like many of us. We often allow our egos to rule us to try and position ourselves ahead of others. We want to be in positions of power, and many of us do not handle power well. Many people who find themselves in a position of power over others use this power to bully and belittle those who are answerable to them. The Bishops of Saskatchewan announced a new province-wide appeal for support of Healing and Reconciliation - sponsored by our dioceses and eparchy here in Saskatchewan. Upon the commitment of the Canadian Council of Catholic Bishops to move forward with a \$30 Million goal from all Catholic dioceses in Canada, this appeal will be counted among those efforts.

Funds will be allocated to national and local initiatives responding to the truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action Involving a financial commitment, as guided by Indigenous communities here in Saskatchewan (cf. Calls to action #61, #71-76; #82).

We are collaborating with potential participants, and consulting with indigenous dialogue partners, including Survivors, Elders, Knowledge keepers, chiefs, and other community members. Out of these conversations, each diocese and eparchy will discern and communicate separately how they will proceed with the Appeal in their respective dioceses and communities.
