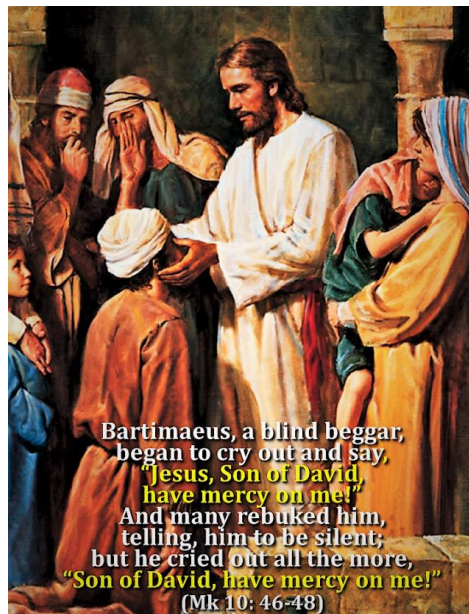
Mass Intention

province-wide appeal for support of Healing and
