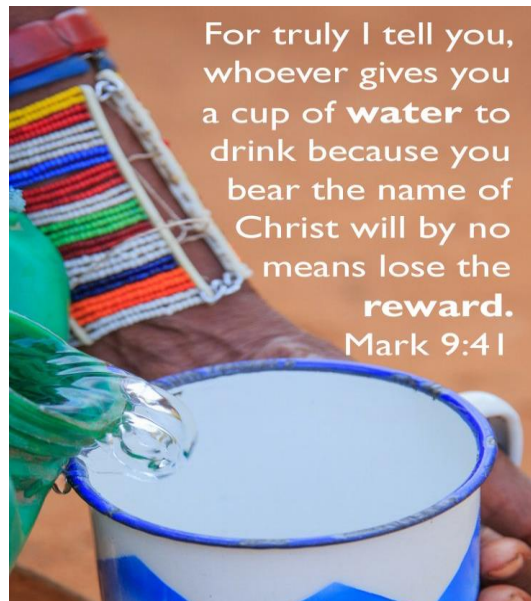
## **Mass Intention**

## National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

The Canadian government proclaimed September 30<sup>th</sup> as a new national statutory holiday, a National day for Truth and Reconciliation to honour survivors, their families, and communities. The Catholic Church has a significant role and responsibility for Truth and Reconciliation in Canada.

With the recent confirmations of unmarked graves, this day gives us an opportunity to reflect on the history of residential schools, and to grow in our understanding towards a commitment to true healing and reconciliation.

### *Prayer for National Day for Healing and Reconciliation*

## Good Neighbor Project Update

The Good Neighbor Project was started at St. Anne's over 10 years ago in response to needs in the community. We partner with Catholic Family Services and other organizations to bring small household necessities to families in need most usually when they are getting housing after being homeless. We collect donations from the community and make packages for families according to their needs. We supply small appliances like coffee makers and toasters, dishes, cutlery, pots and pans, cooking utensils, bowls and baking sheets, linens, personal hygiene items, cleaning supplies, and books, toys and puzzles for the children. We also include some non-perishable foods.

The summer of 2021 will go down as a difficult one for the Good Neighbor Project. The flood under the rectory in June did quite a bit of damage to our storage area and our supplies. (I might add, for Children's Liturgy, Knights of Columbus, the Décor Committee, and Conquest, as well). The evidence is in many nooks and crannies around our facility as we have had to take temporary storage wherever we could.

I would like to thank Bert Perrault and Kelly Nelson for their herculean efforts in mitigating the damage. Let's hope this flood is a once-in-a-lifetime event. We were blessed to have at least a dozen people who helped with the clean up-- washing muddy bins, dishes and other supplies on the front lawn of the parish-- and were ably assisted and facilitated with expertise from Kelly Nelson, and the Restorex crew. We are also very grateful to Larry Tessier and his business, Busy Bee Cleaners. What a huge job it was but many hands made light work!

Because of the stellar work of so many people the number of items that were not able to be cleaned, though not insignificant, were also kept to a minimum. We continue to sort and store donations though we have been trying to keep those to a minimum until we can return the supplies to our regular storage areas.

We have assisted 7 families through the summer and we can continue to provide household goods for families in need thanks to parishioners through donations and prayers.

You help to maintain and grow this beneficial and life-giving project.
